SPIRITUAL KNOWLEDGE

If a man seeks spiritual knowledge, let him plant the foundations of his soul immovably before the Lord, in accordance with God's words to Moses: 'Stand here by Me' (Deuteronomy 5:31). But it should be realized that there are differences among those who stand before the Lord, as is clear from the text, 'There are some standing here who will not taste death till they have seen the kingdom of God come with power' (Mark 9:1). For the Lord does not always appear in glory to all who stand before Him. To beginners He appears in the form of a servant (Philippians 2:7); to those able to follow Him as He climbs the high mountain of His transfiguration He appears in the form of God (Matthew 17:1-9), the form in which He existed before the world came to be (John 17:5). It is therefore possible for the same Lord not to appear in the same way to all who stand before Him, but to appear to some in one way and to others in another way, according to the measure of each person's faith. —St Maximos the Confessor

Where two or three are gathered, whether it be the small band of the apostles or a small mission parish, as long as the members are in communion with the bishop, and they hold to the "faith which was once delivered unto the saints," it is Catholic, as is each and every right-believing, teaching, worshiping and living orthodox parish, united to its Orthodox bishop, who is in turn, united to other Orthodox bishops. This is the Church in which we believe. The little mission church and the great cathedral have the same fullness of Christ, both are catholic. -Fr. Lawrence

This love creates perfection and faultlessness, and when we think on your own death we become free to perform every task for God. Our fallen and imprisoned heart is liberated, and becomes inflamed with the love of God when we enter into a relationship with Him. This love of God engenders a love that permeates our very essence, allowing us to love every person and every creature. Our heart burns with love. This love turns chaos into harmony and it is Divine energy and Divine strength that transforms us into the being God intended us to be.
