into blood, before the great and the terrible day of the Lord come. And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be delivered...—*The Prophet Joel, chapter 2:28ff*

• TITHING:

There are...cases in which an individual truly has nothing left after necessities provided for himself and for those dependent upon him. He should then offer, like the trusting Widow of the gospel, his token "mite" and trust that by God's grace he will "reap abundantly." Besides, it is for the sake of such as these that the rest of us are commanded to be diligent in our giving—that from the abundance given us, others may not do without. Indeed, even the rare person who can make only a "token" offering, if he has first given himself to the Lord, will find ways to contribute to the work of the Lord in ways which are sometimes far more constructive than money itself. He can labor in God's Temple, work for the relief and comfort of the sick and lonely, and finally, when there is nothing left to give, offer his own prayers and sufferings as prayers and petitions of incense before the face of God for the sins of all mankind. —borrowed

CHRISMATION ACTIVATES GRACE GIVEN IN BAPTISM

...beware of supposing this to be plain ointment. For as the Bread of the Eucharist, after the invocation of the Holy Spirit, is mere bread no longer, but the Body of Christ, so also this holy ointment is no longer simple ointment, nor (so to say) common, after the invocation, but the gift of Christ; and by the presence of His Godhead, it causes in us the Holy Spirit.

It is symbolically applied to thy forehead and thy other senses; and while thy body is anointed with visible ointment, thy soul is sanctified by the Holy and life-giving Spirit." —St. Cyril of Jerusalem, Catechetical Lectures

The Holy Spirit confirms the newly-baptized as a child of God (adoption) and begins to guide the newly-born into the communion of a son or daughter with the Father. The Holy Spirit is the beginning of authentic, organic and true union with God that will only deepen and come to radical fulfillment in the Kingdom of the Heavens. As the heavens opened for Christ at His baptism and the Holy Spirit descended and remained upon Him, so for those who are baptized into Christ the heavens are opened and the Holy Spirit descends, and the mysteries of a new and eternal life begin to be unfolded in the life of the believer. This is a life lived in freedom, since God will never force or coerce the believer. We must desire the new and eternal life, and struggle to live it. It is not magic. We know how Pentecost changed the Twelve Disciples from fearful fishermen into fearless evangelists. The personal Pentecost of each of the baptized is meant to effect a like change, and to establish a way of life that is empowered by God.
