• PROGRESS ON DOME:

A couple people have asked me if the fresco work in the dome will be completed by Christmas. A few others have inquired to see if perhaps the work would be done by Lent. We all had a good chuckle about that. Here's the reality: we are on track with the original time estimates given at the Annual Meeting last February. The *Pantocrator* — "Christ in glory" — was completed in early October. Six angels (Seraphim and Cherubim) have now been completed, with six more to go. Then, there are the twelve prophets between the windows, the decorations in and around the windows, and finally, the painting of the three rings at the base of the dome, to finish off the project. Attentive readers of the Annual Meeting report book will recall that we estimated that the entire project would be complete sometime not too long after Pascha. We are encouraged when we remember that churches in the old country were built, painted and decorated over many, many years. It's a question of money, sure (how much at once), but more importantly, it's a matter of quality. And the quality of our frescos is world class. I thank you for your patience, and for the contributions that so many of you have offered in commissioning frescos. The following Prophets are available to commission, at \$4,000 each: Prophets Isaiah, Malachai, Habbakuk, Moses, Jonah, David, Jeremiah, Joel and Zephaniah (David, Solomon, Ezekiel and Elijah have been spoken for). —Fr. Our parishioners will want to hear how they can be involved in serving the needy (the poor, homeless, those with dementia and other disabilities). Also today, Amy will be stationed outside the front doors directly after Liturgy, to gather signatures of those who would like to provide food items for the Catholic Charities Thanksgiving Dinner.

• SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR THE NATIVITY FAST:

The fast in preparation for Christmas—Advent or the Nativity Fast—always begins on November 15, forty days before Christmas. Here are a few suggestions of how to make the fast profitable:

FOOD: During Advent we abstain from meat, eggs, cheese, and all dairy. Changing the diet is really the easiest part of the fast.

SPIRITUAL EFFORT: Much more effort is required when fasting from anger, criticism, resentments, and wandering thoughts, especially those of lust and envy and wasting time in idleness and pointless entertainments.

FAMILY: Involve your children in the Fast. There are many tools for this out there. Be careful: some children wonder why they hear one thing in church (about Jesus, fasting, moral issues, marriage, theology, prayer, etc.) and see another thing at home.

WORSHIP: Attend Vespers regularly on Saturday evening, and by doing so, prepare yourself for Communion on Sunday. Confess at least twice during the Forty Day Fast, one of those times in the week prior to Christmas.

INTERCESSION: Pray for people: at least once a week pray the Akathist to the Theotokos, and ask her to intercede for others.

OFFERINGS: Consciously decide what your weekly/monthly offering will be. Don't wing it—make it part of your spiritual life of thanksgiving to God, and depending on His promises. Set aside something for the poor; give it. **CELEBRATIONS:** Celebrate the Feast of St. Nicholas (at St. Nicholas Church in San Anselmo on Dec. 6). It's an absolutely wonderful experience,

Church in San Anselmo on Dec. 6). It's an absolutely wonderful experience, and will help you refocus on the true meaning of the season, and spiritually refresh you.

WORKS OF MERCY: Volunteer at one of Santa Rosa's many charitable institutions (Catholic Charities, Redwood Gospel Mission, the Living Room,

Pregnancy Counseling Center, etc.).

SCRIPTURE: In the week before Christmas read the Nativity accounts from St. Matthew and St. Luke to your children.

FEAST OF THE ENTRANCE:

Vespers for this Feast, ranked as one of the Twelve Great Feasts, will be served on Wednesday, November 20 at 6:15 PM; Matins and Divine Liturgy on Thursday, starting at 8:30 AM. As we celebrate the Feast of the Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple, the Church very vividly shows us that the goal of this Nativity Advent season—indeed, of our entire life—is to also become a living temple of His glory. The Troparion of the Feast proclaims, "Today is the prelude of God's goodwill." To know that our destiny—body and soul—is to be bearers of the Holy Trinity is the good news of salvation. On Thursday morning, during Matins, the hymns will call us to prepare for Christmas: "Christ is born, glorify Him. Christ is from heaven, receive Him. Christ is on earth, be exalted..." One pastor wrote that "with these words something changes in our life, in the very air we breathe, in the entire mood of the Church's life. It is as if we perceive far, far away, the first light of the greatest possible joy—the coming of God into His world! Thus the Church announces the coming of Christ, the Incarnation of God, His entrance into the world for its salvation." On this feast of the Entrance, we hear how the three year old Virgin was led into the Temple by young maidens, who joyfully carried their lamps before her, who is the Noetic Torch; in a "noble manner they take her into the Holy of Holies, going before and foretelling the ineffable Ray [Christ] which shall shine forth from her, lighting in the spirit those who sit in the darkness of folly." — Vespers Hymn
