#### SUNDAY OF THE HOLY FOREBEARS OF CHRIST:

At Great Vespers this Saturday [and then at Matins on Sunday morning], we praise the glorious men from before and during the Old Covenant law. We honor Adam, Abel, Seth, Enoch, Noah, Melchizedek, Samson, Barak, Jephthah, Nathan, Eleazar, Josiah, Job, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, Aaron, Joshua, Samuel, David, Solomon, Elijah, Elisha and all the prophets, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, "and all the rest," especially Daniel and the three holy youths, Zachariah, John the Baptist, and all those who proclaimed Christ. Likewise we sing praises to the holy women who were made "strong in the days of old by the might of Thy strength, O Lord: Hannah, Judith, Deborah, Huldah, Jael, Esther, Sarah, Miriam, Rachel, Rebecca, and Ruth." Orthodox Christians faithfully preserve the awareness of where we come from. We not only remember that we are from the dust of the earth, but we also remember those who have preceded us, and are joined to us, in holiness, and in faith, and in the spiritual struggle. History is chronological, but the Kingdom of God is ever-present, and we commune with all the righteous who were before us and await us. As brothers and sisters in Christ, they are our forefathers too! The days of preparation for receiving the Incarnation with joy and understanding are drawing to a close. We may come to church on the feast, but if we have not prepared our hearts, we will miss the fullness of the spiritual experience. Everything of value in life is worthy of preparation, and there is no greater event than the birth of the Son. Attend services, pray, read, be charitable, love your neighbor, and give gifts of love and devotion.

The prophets revealed many particulars regarding the coming of the Messiah, specifically: that He will be descended from Abraham (*Gen. 22:18*), from the tribe of Judah (*Gen. 49:9*), from the line of king David (*2 Samuel 7:13; 1 Chron. 17:12-13*), will be born of a Virgin (*Is. 7:14*) in the city of Bethlehem (*Mic. 5:2*), will spread spiritual light (*Is. 9:1-2*), will heal the infirm (*Is. 35:5-6*), will suffer, be pierced, die, be buried in a new grave, then will rise from the dead (*Gen. 49:9-11; Ps. 41:7-10; Is. 50:5-7 and the 53rd chapter; Zach. 12:10; Ps. 16:9-11*), will lead souls from hades (*Zach. 9:11*); they even predicted that not everyone will recognize Him as the Messiah (*Is. 6:9*), but that some would even feud with Him, though unsuccessfully (*Num. 24:17; Deut. 18:18; Ps. 2; Ps. 95:6-8; Ps. 110:1-4; Is. 50:8-9 and 65:1-3*).

#### • TIME FOR SPIRITUAL PREPARATION:

Please prepare yourself for the Feast of the Birth of Christ. It is appropriate and proper for us—priests and people together—to make a Confession prior to receiving Holy Communion on all feast days, but especially before Christmas. It is not appropriate for anyone over seven years of age to receive Holy Communion without a recent Confession. Our bishops teach that if we receive Holy Communion frequently, and we should each week, we should be confess-

ing no less than once a month. We should all make our Confession prior to Christmas Day, so that we may receive Holy Communion at the Divine Liturgy on Christmas Eve and Day. Any person, age 7 and up, who wishes to receive Holy Communion on Nativity Eve or Nativity, should make a confession before Christmas. I especially appeal to the parents of our children to make a confession soon. **Times to make a Confession:** before, during or after Vespers on Saturday evening (try to avoid a Sunday morning Confession, please); Any time on Thursday and Friday, Dec. 20 and 21. The Calendar indicates 4–6 PM, but I will be available all day, both days.
