### • KEEPING THE SOUL LIGHT AND UNBURDENED:

During these unusual and often frustrating days we experience inner turmoil and spiritual confusion rather frequently. Many are stressed out and exhausted. On top of the multiple issues surrounding our experience of COVID-19, political unrest, societal dysfunction, we have fire season already here. We knew it was coming, but, it's come early, and now people

are in danger. MORE THAN EVER, it is spiritually, emotionally and psychologically essential that we look at our interior life and see that without God's help, the knowledge and experience of His love and grace, we have nothing. The outward life of a person, what he or she has, does and came from, is not as important as the inner life of a person, since all the outward things, hopes, accomplishments and dreams might not work out as planned! What then is left for that man or woman? Some of us don't spiritually mature past a Sunday School experience of God, and when the waves of life pound, we feel adrift; when temptations come, we might think they are quite normal; when our faith is tested, as it will be, we might blame God and the Church and then look elsewhere for help—ignorant of the incredible spiritual power of prayer, the Holy Mysteries, church services and spiritual guidance. Help indeed! "The Lord is my strength and my song, He has become my salvation." (Ps. 117:14). God wants us to be strong and mature, to feel freedom of the soul, but for that to happen we give our will and our love to Him, for they are precious to Him and He will sanctify both. "These earthly misfortunes do not separate us from God if we are seeking him sincerely" (Archimandrite Seraphim Aleksiev) Some suggestions for you:

Each and every day, find a little time to be alone and quiet, not engaging in the thoughts that appear like "monkeys leaping from branch to branch." Then, turn your attention to prayer: short, heartfelt and attentive. Keep your conscience clear by self-examination, and come confess and receive Absolution of sins. Then, perhaps you will sense that the soul is light, and has light from God, and is unburdened of sins and negativity. We are impatient people, and forget that just as we do not get in great physical shape after exercising once or twice, neither do we grow spiritually without regular and contact with our Savior. Self-directed exercise and study is not often very effective—confession provides loving direction. Sometimes we need a spiritual "jump-start" when the "batteries of our soul" are depleted—confession can be that very thing. Come, make a confession on Fridays at 11:30 AM in person, or make an appointment to confess in person or by phone with me or Fr. Nicholas or Fr. John. —Fr. Lawrence
