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• TROPARION OF THE RESURRECTION, Tone Six:

The angelic powers were at Thy tomb; the guards became as dead men. Mary stood by Thy grave, seeking Thy most pure body. Thou didst capture hades, not being tempted by it. Thou didst come to the Virgin granting life. O Lord who didst rise from the dead: Glory to Thee.

• TROPARION OF TRANSFIGURATION, Tone Seven:

Thou wast transfigured on the mount, O Christ our God, showing Thy glory to Thy disciples as far as they could bear it. By the prayers of the Theotokos, let Thine everlasting light shine forth upon us sinners. O Giver of Light, glory to Thee.

• KONTAKION OF THE TRANSFIGURATION, Tone Seven:

On the mountain wast Thou transfigured, O Christ God, and Thy disciples beheld Thy glory as far as they could see it; so that when they would behold Thee crucified, they would understand that Thy suffering was voluntary, and would proclaim to the world that Thou art truly the Radiance of the Father.

DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY:

The Diocesan Assembly (gathering of clergy and representatives from all the parishes of the Diocese of the West) will be held this year in Las Vegas, NV at St. Paul Orthodox Church, October 11–14. Our representatives will be Michael Dovey, Alexander Stameroff, Deacon Justin and myself, along with Emma Anderson, who will attend as an official observer and to help sing at the liturgical services.

• AUGUST 15 ~ FEAST OF DORMITION:

The Feast Day of the Dormition, August 15, directs our attention to final things: our death, the Lord's promise to raise us from death to life-eternal, and of course, the great example of the fulfillment of that promise in the death and *translation* of the Holy Virgin Mary. The feast celebrates her death and her being raised to the *life of the age to come*—which is why we call it a *translation*. This feast is a *Pascha of the Theotokos*, her "translation" from her death to the resurrection, from earth to heaven. The Vigil will be on Saturday, August 14 at 5 PM, with Liturgy on Sunday. We expect His Grace, Bishop Daniel to be praying with us for the Vigil. He plans to serve at the Monastery feast day in Calistoga the next day.

• ON THE TRANSFIGURATION:

The Feast of the Transfiguration is a revelation not just of the identity of our Lord Jesus, but of our potential identity as well. You see, the whole of the Orthodox Faith is about shaping you and me to be "like Christ." All our liturgies, spiritual disciplines, prayers, actions, homilies, and worship are designed to so reshape you and me that we take on the likeness of Jesus Christ Himself. The ultimate work in the Eucharist is to have us take Christ within us so that we can be "fed" by Him and become "like" Him. After all, you are what you eat! Today, are you satisfied with playing at the periphery of this awesome truth, or are you finally willing to press into this wondrous Faith with purpose and love? Are you willing to be made into His likeness by the collected wisdom of 20 centuries of Orthodox insight, or will you be satisfied merely standing in the "narthex" of the Faith? On this Feast Day when He reveals Himself AND reveals what you could be, it's time to be Orthodox on Purpose! —Father Barnabas Powell, from his blog post
