• DAY OF REJOICING:

During Holy Week and Bright Week, other than funerals, the Church forbids us to sing memorial hymns and *Panikhidas*. Why? Because Christ has destroyed the power of the devil and death by His death and resurrection, and the faithful are alive in Him. Memorial services are not necessary since Pascha is the perfect and all-encompassing memorial; what more could be desired. However, on the Tuesday after Bright Week we once again begin to sing hymns for those who have departed this life. I will be visiting the following cemeteries to bless graves:

11 AM at the Forestville Cemetery

Noon at Healdsburg's Oak Mound Cemetery (Bring a picnic)

2 PM at the Windsor Cemetery

• GRATITUDE:

Christ is risen. We all give thanks for the tremendous blessings of Holy Week and Pascha, especially for those who organized all the various ingredients that make for a successful and bright feast. There are countless things to do to prepare for Holy Week and Pascha, to manage during Pascha and to arrange after Pascha. Please, extend a personal word of thanks to those that did so much to make our Paschal Feast so beautiful.

• RENEWAL SUNDAY:

The Sunday after Pascha is called by three names: St. Thomas Sunday, Anti-Pascha and Renewal Sunday. Accordingly, we hear the Gospel from John 20:19. We hear Jesus say: "Thomas, because thou hast seen Me, thou hast believed. Blessed are they that have not seen and yet have believed." Faith is not discovered by investigation (although it paves the way) or even by seeing. Keep in mind that the Apostles, the Pharisees and Judas all saw the incredible miracles. Not all believed (St. Matthew records that "they worshipped Him, but some doubted"). Faith is given, revealed, received, learned, lived and then understood only when one meets and accepts the Lord Jesus Christ. Faith is about a person, not acquiring doctrine. Theology is a result of knowing Christ. Remember the Lord's words to Peter: "flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in Heaven." We come to faith because the Father, Who loves us before we love Him, reveals Jesus to us. Seeing is believing we say. However, from the beginning the evil one, that liar, along with hypocrites, charlatans, thieves, philosophers, politicians, those guessing and those deceiving, and you name it, have used the approach that seeing is believing only to dupe the mind and heart; and this has lead to all kinds of falsehoods, fictions and disasters, sorrows, disappointments, heresies and sins. Only God, the Risen Lord, to be exact, can cut through fiction, lies and deception; and He only can gently present Himself to the human heart (and then the mind), and bring a person, who is willing, to the illumination of faith. We believe—then we understand. And then we will call Jesus, Lord. Only God can get us there, and only if we offer Him a little way in to ourselves. Jesus, says Luke, "opened their minds to understand the Scriptures," particularly that "the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead." And so he does for us as well. So, this is one aspect of Renewal Sunday. Let us not forget that we are in a battle for our spiritual lives; we exercise and feed the soul. Be faithful, and the Lord will bring you to knowledge. —Fr Lawrence
