
TASKS TO DO

- KONTAKION OF THE CROSS, Tone Four:

As Thou wast voluntarily raised upon the Cross for our sake, grant mercy to those who are called by Thy Name, O Christ God; make all Orthodox Christians glad by Thy power, granting them victories over their adversaries by bestowing on them the invincible trophy, Thy weapon of peace!

We sorrow and mourn at the repose of the faithful servant of God, Stephen Tom Pellizzer, on Friday—providentially on the feast of the *Uncovering of the Relics of the Protomartyr Stephen*. Our grief is mixed with hope, for we look for and anticipate the life of the age to come and the resurrection from the dead. A full obituary will be given in due time, but for now, let us remember that Tom and Denise and their children were received into the Orthodox Church on February 14, 1998. Since that time, both Tom and Denise have faithfully served the Church and the community of Santa Rosa in ways too many to recount: liturgical, social, charitable, electrical, prayerful support of his brothers and sisters within and outside of the parish. Tom especially loved the services of the Church, and rarely missed a feast day, panikhida, wedding or baptism. It was a joy to sing with him for so many of us for all these years. May the Lord grant him Paradise, and to his family and many Godchildren and friends, consolation and comfort. Memory Eternal.

The "liturgical day," which is to say, the day as God created it, begins in

the evening with the setting of the sun, following the Biblical account of creation: "And there was evening and there was morning, one day" (Gen 1.5). Vespers is the first service of the Daily Cycle, and it takes place in the early evening. It begins with the chanting of the evening psalm: "... the sun knows its time for setting, Thou makest darkness and it is night ..." (Ps 103.19–20). Glorifying God's creation of the world and thanking Him for it, this psalm is mankind's first act of worship, for we first of all meet God as our Creator. The service of Vespers takes us through creation, sin, and salvation in Christ. On Saturday evening it guides us in our meditation and celebration of the incarnation, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ—this is the Gospel message in song and psalms. On other days, Vespers directs us to praise God for the particular saints whose memories we celebrate. It prepares us for the sleep of the night and the dawn of the new day to come the Day of the Lord, which is the Resurrection. It begins our movement into the most perfect communion with God in the Eucharistic mystery of Holy Communion. Resurrectional Vespers is every Saturday at 5 PM.
